

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What does MyFolio Core invest in?

Our experts invest across a broad universe of funds that include internal and external managers and a combination of actively managed and lower-cost Index funds. MyFolio Core includes allocations to both traditional growth assets and diversifying defensive assets with a different expected return profile. This combination provides diversification benefits to the range.

By combining different types of investments, we believe we can achieve the best possible return for each risk level.





As you move up the risk levels, you would typically expect to see a higher proportion of the portfolio invested in growth assets and less in defensive assets.



Key risks

The value of investments and the income from them can fall and investors may get back less than the amount invested.

The fund invests in securities which are subject to the risk that the issuer may default on interest or capital payments.

The fund price can go up or down daily for a variety of reasons including changes in interest rates, inflation expectations or the perceived credit quality of individual countries or securities.

The fund invests in equity and equity related securities. These are sensitive to variations in the stock markets which can be volatile and change substantially in short periods of time.

The fund invests in emerging market equities and / or bonds. Investing in emerging markets involves a greater risk of loss than investing in more developed markets due to, among other factors, greater political, tax, economic, foreign exchange, liquidity and regulatory risks.

Commercial property is less liquid than other asset classes such as bonds or equities. Selling property can be a lengthy process so investors in the fund should be aware that they may not be able to sell their investment when they want to.

Commercial property transaction charges are higher than those which apply in other asset classes. Investors should be aware that a high volume of transactions would have a material impact on fund returns.

Property valuation is a matter of judgment by an independent valuer and is therefore a matter of the valuer's opinion rather than fact.

The fund may hold money-market instruments, the value of which may be subject to adverse movements in extreme market conditions.

The use of derivatives carries the risk of reduced liquidity, substantial loss and increased volatility in adverse market conditions, such as a failure amongst market participants. The use of derivatives may result in the fund being leveraged (where market exposure and thus the potential for loss by the fund exceeds the amount it has invested) and in these market conditions the effect of leverage will be to magnify losses.

The fund invests in high yielding bonds which carry a greater risk of default than those with lower yields.

The fund employs a single swinging pricing methodology to protect against the dilution impact of transaction costs. Due to the high transaction charges associated with the fund's assets, a change in the pricing basis will result in a significant movement in the fund's published price.

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Who runs the MyFolio Core Funds?

The responsibility for the MyFolio Funds lies across experienced portfolio managers, who are all part of the Client Investment Solutions Team.

The Core Funds are managed by Katie Trowsdale and Robert Bowie.
