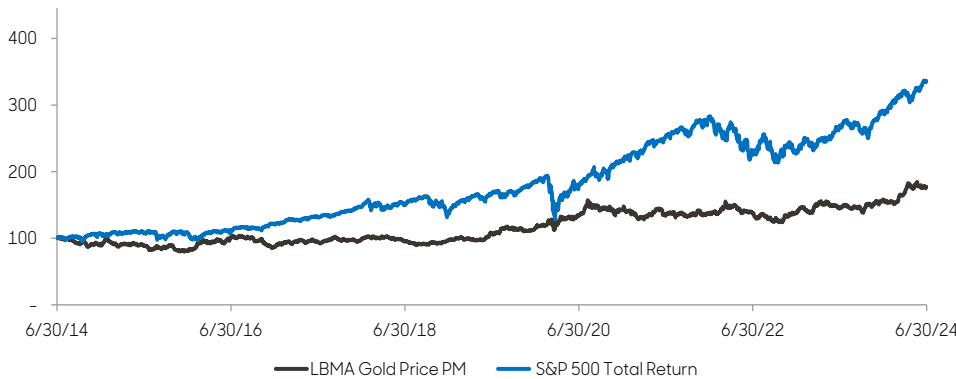

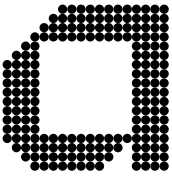
abrdrn Physical Gold Shares ETF (SGOL) seeks to reflect the performance of the price of gold bullion, less the Trust's expenses.

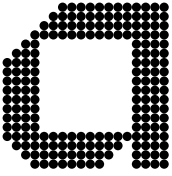
